

**Accession Monitoring Report
Immigration and Nationality Directorate**

CORRECTIONS

The numbers in the column 'Registered Workers with Dependants' in Table 4 (publications from March 2006 to September 2006) or Table 5 (publications to December 2005) are incorrect. Registered workers with dependants both under 17 *and* 17 and over have been included twice in the totals. The corrected figures are shown in Table 5 in the current Accession Monitoring Report, for May 2004 to December 2006.

The percentages of registered workers shown in Chart 5 of the Accession Monitoring Reports published between December 2005 and September 2006 are the percentage of the top ten occupations; however, the note below the chart incorrectly states that they are percentages of all registered workers. In the current Accession Monitoring Report, for May 2004 to December 2006, "Other occupations" has been added to the chart (now numbered Chart 6) so that the percentages do represent the percentage of all registered workers.

Up to and including September 2006, the Accession Monitoring Reports included a column in Table 17 showing the number of "Terminated" tax credits applications. However, it has come to light that the data available on these applications are only partial, and the column has therefore been withdrawn from the current report and should be ignored in past reports.

The figure for the number of applications for tax-funded, income-related benefits from A8 nationals in Scotland published in Table 14 is incorrect in the Accession Monitoring Reports published between March 2006 and September 2006. The correct number is published in Table 15 in the Accession Monitoring Report for May 2004 to December 2006.

The number of dependants in the column 'Dependants of registered workers aged 17 and over' was 4070 in 2004, and not as shown in Table 4: Registered workers' dependants, May 2004 – September 2006.

The number of children in applications approved in the quarter to September 2006 was 10,740, and not as shown in Section 18: Applications for Child Benefit.
